

Tips For Filming at Home

Equipment & Framing

Close windows, doors, and silence any electronic devices that could cause distractions. Use a room with soft furnishings (like carpets, curtains, or cushioned furniture) to minimize echo and improve sound quality. Keep your recording device within one meter of your face to capture your voice well. If you're farther away, consider using a clip-on microphone to amplify your sound.

Background & Environment

Check your background to ensure it is neat and uncluttered, minimizing distractions for your viewers. A plain wall or simple backdrop works best. Avoid sitting directly in front of a window or a very bright light source, as this can create backlighting issues. Minimal décor is best to keep the focus on you, not the surroundings. Opt for a space with subtle, non-distracting elements.



Appearance

Choose an outfit that contrasts with your background, so you stand out on camera. If your background is light, opt for darker tones, and vice versa. Avoid patterns like stripes or bold colours that can be distracting on camera. Simple, solid colors are typically the best choice for a polished look. Lastly, ensure your clothing is comfortable and appropriate for the tone of your video.

Be mindful of battery life and storage space on your device to avoid interruptions while filming.
